

DIY projects and home, car, and phone repairs. Centerville has eco-friendly tools for the community's garden maintenance needs. With free and easy access to these tools, cost barriers are removed and communities have the opportunity to learn, build, restore, reuse and share resources, and embrace green practices that cultivate sustainable neighborhoods.
